In Spring 2023, we published an article from Vince Walls, '72 that detailed his caddie experience (https://plattscholar.org/alumni-publications/.) In response, the letter below was sent to the Trust.



Dear Vince,

I so much enjoyed your story in the Platt newsletter. It brought back many memories and it was amazing how many of mine overlapped with yours.

I also started college in 1968. It wasn't LaSalle University but Eastern Baptist College in Wayne, very close to Villanova University. I, too, had a paper route and invested the profits in stocks while in high school.

Just as you starting your journey, mine started when my best friend, a waiter at Squires, told me there was an opening. I applied and got the job. Talk about culture shock. Going from collecting 40 cents a week with a dime tip I was now getting much bigger tips for waiting on members and even more driving their cadillacs from the upper parking lot to the front door of the club.

My first three years of college I worked Thursday dinners and weekends and then six days a week over the summer. My senior year I decided to caddie to spend more time with these very successful men then just a few minutes serving them a meal. They encouraged me to apply for a Platt scholarship, which I did that helped with my senior year tuition.

You took a different approach by using your early stock buying to launch a career in securities. I graduated with an elementary education degree and came back to teach in my alma mater Hatboro-Horsham District for 12 years. The last five years I learned the ropes of buying multi-family properties and had enough cash flow to retire from teaching to do the real estate full time.

Just like you, I have fond memories with many members. I served lunch to Leonard Toss and Jim Murray the day after he bought the Eagles. When George Fazio was not in an airplane he would stay with Squire pro, Jack Gately in his home on the course. Many times young Tom Fazio would join Uncle George for a round of golf.

One morning, George, Tom and member John Dynewski, Philadelphia Amateur Champion (1954–55, 1962) had a game planned with a special guest, Bob Hope. They were drinking coffee waiting for the rain to stop when Mr. Hope called me over and asked if any caddies were still around. I found three playing penny poker between two benches. When Bob heard this his eyes got big and said, 'I want in the game.' Off we went with most of the members following. He introduced himself as Bob, learned their names, and ask if he could join the game. Mr. Hope was non-stop asking the kids questions. What grade are you in, which members do you like to caddie for, did they have any good jokes they would like to share. The rain stopped but before leaving he pulled out a magic marker and ask each boy for a card from the deck. He wrote on the cards their name then "Fun playing poker with you" signed and dated.

Frank Chirkinian was a Squires member but wasn't around very often especially during the summer with his busy TV schedule. One memory was when he was playing Squires on the day of the final round of the British Open. He took me aside and handed me a piece of paper with a name and a phone number. He said to call this friend early afternoon as the Open would do done by then with the five hour difference. He wanted me to write down what each player in the final group did on the last three holes. I called the friend, got the information and handed my notes to Mr. C. when no one was around as instructed. When the telecast came on, Frank started making bets that this player would

make a 15-foot putt, which of course he did. He then let them win a few but had cleaned up by the time the Open was over. When the last putt went in, he put all the money on the table and told them to take back what they had bet and what he had done. They all had a great laugh and talked about that afternoon for weeks.

One late afternoon after other members had left, Ed Sabol of NFL Films, was waiting for his car to be delivered after being inspected and shared with me his story of how NFL films got started. He filmed son Steve with an 8 mm camera playing high school football at Haverford High. He also took shots of the bench, the crowd, cheer leaders and then added audio and music. He showed it to Pete Rozelle and as they say the rest is history. Lots of Philadelphia connections with both Ed and Steve Sabol and John Facenda doing the commentary.

I also caddied for Cardinal Krol. He was playing Squires with priests who were good golfers just like he did with you. On a par three, he hit a duck hook that landed across the street in Oak Terrace Golf Club. I handed him another ball but he waived me off. The next thing I know he grabs his sand wedge, walks across the street, finds his ball and hits it onto the green. He two putts and says give me a four. As we walked down the next fairway he told me the Archdiocese had recently purchased Oak Terrace for a new cemetery so it was not out of bounds for any in his foursome. Later the land was bought from the Archdiocese, stayed a golf course and is now Talamore Country Club.

Another caddie highlight was being on the bags of two City Amateur champs. Bill Hyndman, III (1935, 1958, 1965) and Alan Susell (1969). They were playing against 20-plus handicaps. Both shot four under par and lost the match!

I was honored to serve as a Platt Trustee as well as becoming a lifetime member to continue to give back to this great caddie scholarship program. It was the easiest loop of my caddie carrier. I was never in the rough or in trees looking for balls.

Yes, to pay it forward is so important. When I joined Old York Road I always took a caddie to mentor just like others had done for me. I organized a J. Wood Platt in house tournament to raise contributions, since we had more outgo then income for our caddies from Platt funds. For a few years OYR was within the top 20 clubs in GAP with Platt contributions which I am very proud to have accomplished.

After starting this tournament, I received a call from Platt president Dr. David Junkin to see if I would be interested in serving as a trustee. I was honored to accepted and served from 2001 to 2009 as well as becoming a lifetime member to continue to give back to this great caddie scholarship program.

While a Trustee, the Dawn to Dusk concept was developed and I suggested the first one be held at Old York Road, which it was. Tina Gregor was the driving force getting this off the ground and enjoyed working with her. So glad with her leadership it has continued to get bigger and better each year.

So it's been 50 years for me as well as a J.W. Platt Scholar and thought you summed it up perfectly that we received Bachelor Degrees from Universities but the Bachelor of Life Degree we learned from the people we caddied for, who mentored us, and are for forever grateful.

It's great to see there is an active alumni committee. Maybe we should go to the alumni gathering at Whitemarsh Valley on June 15. Us to two old farts could tell stories of our memorable loops 50+years ago

We are also close in our years of marriage. You at 45 years and Debbie and I are at 44. She is a golfer and we have won OYR Mixed Championship four times, lost in the finals twice, but that was decades ago. We have been blessed with two very successful children who both live close by. Our daughter didn't take up golf but our son did and has been OYR club champ the last three years. Just recently he was tied for the lead out of 144 golfers in the Middle-Amateur after the first day shooting even par. The kids each gave us our first grandbabies 25 days apart. Both boys have just started walking so exciting times. My Christmas present to both, even before they could walk, was a putter.
